Dear Supporters,

As we move through the summer, I want to thank you for standing with us during a particularly challenging time.

Between May and July 2025, you helped us feed 1,518 people, including 936 adults and 582 children, a 10.9% increase from the same period last year. This rising demand shows that food insecurity in our community remains a pressing issue.

Over the past six months, food distributed has consistently outweighed food received, with March showing the largest gap. Although June offered a brief boost, stock levels remain fragile.

Your support has made a real difference. From donations to volunteering, every contribution helps us respond to need with dignity and compassion.

Looking ahead, we're focusing on rebuilding stock, expanding partnerships, and sharing more stories of the lives changed through your support — because behind every statistic is a person who matters. Thank you for being part of this mission.

Driven by our own road legends—Trevor, Ray, Mick, Richard, Nigel and David—it's carried everything from supermarket donations and Amazon deliveries weighing up to a ton, to crates, chairs and the odd broomstick during warehouse moves.

Moving our base closer to Dunstable has halved its weekly mileage, giving the old engine a breather. And though rust is creeping in and welding was needed for the last MOT, our van is still first to start and last to complain.

There are whispers that, one day, we might replace it—maybe even with an electric van to set an example for the community. But for now, our Silver Dream Racer remains an essential part of the team, proving that even the humblest vehicle can carry a great mission. Long may it keep on rolling
